
## Assembly Instructions Museum Bars®

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8. In one corner of the stretcher bar, move the two wood bars of the corner with your fingers to orient them perfectly even with each other. Place the tightening rod in a hole on the ball nut and (when facing length of dowel) turn clockwise until snug. As you tighten, the pencil line next to the alphanumeric marking should remain straight.

9. Align & tighten the diagonally opposite corner next. Then do the other two corners, then braces.

10. Go back and tighten all around 1 or 2 turns.



11. Insert retaining pins into holes on locking sleeves to prevent possibility of them coming loose if joint is ever expanded to tighten loose art fabric or painting; pins are most easily inserted with needle nose pliers or small wire cutters.

Now your Museum Bar is ready for art fabric!
